


GEOCACHING

 Prerequisite: A Cadet must have earned the **GPS merit badge** before being awarded the **Geocaching merit badge**.



Geocaching (GEE-oh-cash-ing) is a popular outdoor activity that uses a handheld GPS receiver or smart phone with live-enabled geocaching application to find containers (caches) hidden by others and then share their experiences online.

Equipment Required: Computer with Internet connection, GPS receiver; or as an alternative to a GPS receiver, you can use a smart phone with a geocaching application where cell phone service is available.

1. Get to know the geocaching website. Geocaching.com is the official site of the geocaching community and an excellent source for information on all things having to do with geocaching. There are other websites that offer geocaching information but your most reliable source is this site.

#4 • Log your experience at geocaching.com.

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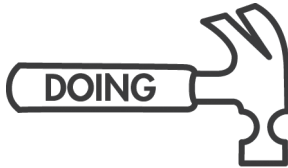
